## D. 12 The status of Argentina's exploration

On November 6, 2003, a workshop took place on "The status of Argentina's exploration" at the Sofitel Hotel in Buenos Aires, organized by the IAPG's Exploration and Development Committee. With the purpose of performing an analysis and an interchange of ideas during the workshop, the Committee drew up a discussion paper, a summary of which has been published, where an analysis of the status of exploration, the main factors determining and affecting its decisions and processes, and a diagnosis of the causes which led to the present situation, were shown. Likewise a summary of the ideas put forward in the workshop has also been published.
